



Bhasha Sanchika, the national digital repository for Indian languages developed by the Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL), integrates language preservation, dissemination, and technological innovation to safeguard and provide access to India's diverse languages, especially endangered and lesser-known languages.

01 Sanchika is a D-Space-based open source platform managed by the SPPEL team, CIIL, which already hosts a substantial collection of linguistic data.

02 Bhasha Sanchika serves as a platform for researchers, community members, and individuals interested in digitally archiving and preserving their linguistic data.

03 SPPEL - Established by the Ministry of Education in 2013, SPPEL documents India's endangered languages through linguistic and ethnographic resources, collaborating with experts and communities across six zones covering 117 languages. Currently, SPPEL has a collection of 5000+ data in Sanchika.
